Burghley is one of the largest and grandest surviving houses of the sixteenth century and a magnificent example of the great Elizabethan 'prodigy' houses.

Deene Park is a wonderful eclectic mix of architectural styles, having evolved through the centuries. Before the Norman Conquest and for 150 years afterwards the Manor Of Deene belonged to the Abbey Of Westminster and was used occasionally by the Abbot.

Local History

Rutland County Museum

The history of the smallest county in England is represented by Rutland County Museum in Oakham, which draws from rural life and archaeology to explore the history of Rutland. It exhibits include an Ice Age bison horn and extinct oysters from the Triassic & Jurassic periods.

Oakham Castle

The place currently known as Oakham Castle was originally the Great Hall of a much larger fortified manor. Originally built in the 12th century by Oakham's Lord Of The Manor. The castle is one of the longest running seats of justice in England.

Normanton Church

Normanton Church is Rutland's most famous landmark and a lasting reminder of the landscape prior to its flooding in the 1970's to create Rutland Water. The first church was built here in the 14th century, and a later iteration was constructed in the 18th century.

Exton Church

St Peter and St Paul's church in Exton, Rutland, is a large medieval church which contains a wide set of monuments. Located several miles east of Oakham, the church was first recorded in 1225 though most of the structure dates to the 14th century.

Oakham Market Cross and Stocks

Oakham has historically been a market town, a place where people come from surrounding villages to engage in trade. The "Buttercross" standing in Oakham dates from the 17th century, with 8 timber posts supporting a slate roof. Under this structure are the wooden stocks, which would have restrained criminals for the purpose of public humiliation.

Ashwell Prison Ghost Hunt

Ghost hunting at Ashwell Prison in Rutland is not for the faint-hearted! Ashwell Prison, formerly known as HM Prison Ashwell was a Category C men's prison and is known for many spooky sightings!

Gorse Field, Harris Grove & Ball's Meadow

A lovely mixture of woodland and open grassland is on the outskirts of the traditional market town of Oakham. The site offers stunning views over the surrounding countryside and Rutland Water.

Fineshade Wood

Whether you want to have a leisurely wander through the trees, get the kids to run off some steam at one of the exciting plays areas or even go on a bike ride. Fineshade is bursting with opportunities to explore the great outdoors.

Clipsham Yew Tree Avenue

The fascinating yet tranquil Yew Tree Avenue at Clipsham is over 200 years old, consisting of over 150 clipped Yew Trees in all manner of unusual shapes. Costs nothing to visit and a pleasant place to sit and enjoy a picnic.

Grafton Park Wood

An interesting yet also slightly freaky woodland. The woodland is an ex-air force base from WWII, the American Airforce used the woodland as camouflage for their buildings, many of which still remain, although slightly derelict.

Fermyn Woods

A stunning ancient woodland set just south of Corby. With walking trials, orienteering routes, several play areas and a café.

Foxton Locks

Is a Grade II* listed site, and home to the longest, steepest staircase flight of locks in Britain and sits in 34 acres of natural green spaces with a wide variety of wildlife.
